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<p>Thoughts from a Preacher</p>	<p>I think the most encouraging and surprising way that David depends on the Lord comes about a third of the way through the psalm: "Remember your mercy, O Lord, and your steadfast love, for they have been from of old. Remember not the sins of my youth or my transgressions; according to your steadfast love remember me, for the sake of your goodness, O Lord!" David contrasts his sin over and against the steadfast love of the Lord. God's mercy and steadfast love are ancient, far more ancient than David's youthful transgressions. How could David's sin even hold a candle to the mercy and love of the Lord? Likewise for you: God's steadfast love has been around a lot longer than you have.</p> <p>Caleb Adkisson</p>
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
