To obey, to be ready and for every good work, speak evil of no one, to be peaceable, gentle, showing all humility to all men.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Both were designed to be sung by the Jewish people, to and about a righteous Jewish King who is leading well and connected to God. <input type="checkbox"/> The words contract the use of I that we see in Psalm 19 and change to "Your" referring to the king and the use of "We". <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 20 is the people's prayer for the King and Psalm 21 is the acknowledgement from God. <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 20:1-5 The people are saying to the King this is what we are asking God to do with you, for you. The word "May" is used 6 times in 5 verses.(READ) <input type="checkbox"/> In the first 5 verses which verse is given that this is an indication that the king behaves righteously? <input type="checkbox"/> People are praying for their leader who is seeking after God. <input type="checkbox"/> V 6 through 9- Having a godly leader is wonderful, because he is protected, answers his prayers, and provides an aspect of trust that unrighteous leaders do not possess and he is responsive to the people, but mostly to God! These people have hope in their leader because they understand the most important concept, TRUST in God before Military or Economic might. <input type="checkbox"/> Psalm 21 the people are joyful that God listened to their requests made on behalf of the king. <input type="checkbox"/> We are called to contend for the Faith, we are told to be ready to reprove, rebuke, exhort but we must take the road of Peter and Timothy and John the Baptist. It is ok to point out sin, but how you do so is as important. <input type="checkbox"/> V8 READ God will lay hold of the enemies, seizing them by His right hand, and consume them like a fiery furnace. The wrath of the Lord will swallow them up. This is the case that we see in history. As nations turn away from God, God raises up other nations for their destruction. The Canaanite people were destroyed for their sins by the Israelites. The northern nation of Israel was destroyed by Assyria because of their sins.
