In Psalms 82:6, the judges of Israel were called "gods" because of their representative position of authority and responsibility among the people. These judges were God's representatives, charged with executing fair and impartial judgments in Israel (Psalms 82:2-4). To go before the judges was to go before God (cf. Exodus 21:6; 22:8-9,28), for they were charged with rendering God's judgments (Deuteronomy 1:16-17). Jeremiah 5:1 God waits for Judges to behave righteously Eccl 8:11 What happens when judges do not behave righteously. Earthly judges still suffer physical death(gods) don't die. The 82nd Psalm depicts God rebuking these "gods" (the unjust judges) for their corruption of justice. Because they failed to judge righteously, God would now judge them (Psalms 82:1,7-8). Even so, because of their God-given position of power, the psalmist called the unrighteous judges "gods."
