Connecting Scriptures/Thoughts	Psalm 32	
<p>As we read Psalm 32 , I hope some of us are able to connect to the thoughts of David. To recognize we too have been in the same place as David.</p> <p>David is overjoyed, happy, thankful because he knows, he emphatically believes and trusts that God has pardoned his sin.</p> <p>(1-2) Blessed-fullness and completeness in life.</p> <p>Sermon on the Mount, Matthew 5</p> <p>Transgression- rebellion/revolt Sin- missing the mark/fall short Iniquity- corrupt, perverse, twisted</p> <p>David reflects on what he was like before he confessed his sins to God and it wasn't good. (Bones wasted away) (Hand heavy upon me) (strength dried up)</p> <p>Depression is often linked to real or even imagined feelings of guilt(not all depression) but some. IN Christ, the weight of sin is removed.</p> <p>1 John 3:20</p> <p>(6) Turn to God when the storms of life hit hard</p> <p>(7) When life hits hard do you turn to God first or last? Do you count on Him for deliverance and help? Haven't you always wanted a secret safe hiding place? David says you have exactly that in the Lord!</p> <p>(8) God is speaking here! God has given you the ability to listen, to hear, to decide and there is no excuse.</p> <p>2 Peter 1:3</p>	<p>[1] Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered.</p> <p>[2] Blessed is the man against whom the LORD counts no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit.</p> <p>[3] For when I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long.</p> <p>[4] For day and night your hand was heavy upon me; my strength was dried up by the heat of summer. Selah</p> <p>[5] I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD," and you forgave the iniquity of my sin. Selah</p> <p>[6] Therefore let everyone who is godly offer prayer to you at a time when you may be found; surely in the rush of great waters, they shall not reach him.</p> <p>[7] You are a hiding place for me; you preserve me from trouble; you surround me with shouts of deliverance. Selah</p> <p>[8] I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my eye upon you.</p> <p>[9] Be not like a horse or a mule, without understanding, which must be curbed with bit and bridle, or it will not stay near you.</p> <p>[10] Many are the sorrows of the wicked, but steadfast love surrounds the one who trusts in the LORD.</p> <p>[11] Be glad in the LORD, and rejoice, O righteous, and shout for joy, all you upright in heart!</p>

<p>(9) God will not force you into FAITH</p> <p>(10-11) When we follow God, confess sins and keep our faith strong, we have reason to rejoice.</p>	
<p>Connecting Scriptures/Thoughts</p>	<p>Psalm 33</p>
<p>V 5 and 6 stand out. The earth is full of his steadfast love of the Lord. By His word the heavens were made. Reflect how we see the love of God on the earth? Think of nature and creation.</p> <p>Romans 1:20 Psalm 139:13-14 Genesis 1:26-27 Job 8:4-11</p> <p>V 10-11 Trust in God or the World/Politics?</p> <p>V13-15 The Lord sees all the children of man.... All inhabitants He fashioned the hearts of them all Proverbs 15:3</p> <p>V16-17 Psalm 44:4-8</p> <p>V18-20 God takes care of those who fear Him, hope in His steadfast love. We read in earlier Psalms, those who wait on the Lord. Notice that God does not say He will remove the famine but keep you alive in famine.</p>	<p>[1] Shout for joy in the LORD, O you righteous! Praise befits the upright.</p> <p>[2] Give thanks to the LORD with the lyre; make melody to him with the harp of ten strings!</p> <p>[3] Sing to him a new song; play skillfully on the strings, with loud shouts.</p> <p>[4] For the word of the LORD is upright, and all his work is done in faithfulness.</p> <p>[5] He loves righteousness and justice; the earth is full of the steadfast love of the LORD.</p> <p>[6] By the word of the LORD the heavens were made, and by the breath of his mouth all their host.</p> <p>[7] He gathers the waters of the sea as a heap; he puts the deeps in storehouses.</p> <p>[8] Let all the earth fear the LORD; let all the inhabitants of the world stand in awe of him!</p> <p>[9] For he spoke, and it came to be; he commanded, and it stood firm.</p> <p>[10] The LORD brings the counsel of the nations to nothing; he frustrates the plans of the peoples.</p> <p>[11] The counsel of the LORD stands forever, the plans of his heart to all generations.</p> <p>[12] Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD, the people whom he has chosen as his heritage!</p> <p>[13] The LORD looks down from heaven; he sees all the children of man;</p> <p>[14] from where he sits enthroned he looks out on all the inhabitants of the earth,</p> <p>[15] he who fashions the hearts of them all and observes all their deeds.</p> <p>[16] The king is not saved by his great army; a warrior is not delivered by his great strength.</p> <p>[17] The war horse is a false hope for salvation, and by its great might it cannot rescue.</p> <p>[18] Behold, the eye of the LORD is on those who fear him, on those who hope in his steadfast love,</p> <p>[19] that he may deliver their soul from death and keep them alive in famine.</p> <p>[20] Our soul waits for the LORD; he is our help and our</p>

[21] For our heart is glad in him, because we trust in his holy name.
