To ear God and be heard!</p> <p>The difference between a child of God and the wicked is that the child of God listens to the voice of the Lord! Romants 10:17</p> <p>Matthew 4:4 How important is the word of God to you. Conversations can be had be reading His word and asking in prayer.</p> <p>Luke 18:1 Pray and don't lose heart! For he has ^uheard the voice of my pleas for mercy.</p> <p>⁷ The Lord is my strength and ^vmy shield; in him my heart ^wtrusts, and I am helped; my heart exults, and with my ^xsong I give thanks to him.</p> <p>⁸ The Lord is the strength of his people;² he is ^ythe saving refuge of his anointed.</p> <p>⁹ Oh, save your people and bless ^zyour heritage! ^aBe their shepherd and ^bcarry them forever.</p>

<p>David is calling for angels to give God glory. Why might he have done this?</p> <p>Worship is defined by giving to God not getting from God. Worship involves your mind and will. Surrendering what you want for what God wants.</p> <p>V3-9 Are often seen as a storm</p>	<p>Ascribe to the Lord, O heavenly beings,¹ ascribe to the Lord glory and strength.</p> <p>² Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his name; worship the Lord in ^dthe splendor of holiness.²</p> <p>³ The voice of the Lord is over ^ethe waters; the God of glory ^fthunders, the Lord, over many waters.</p> <p>⁴ The voice of the Lord is ^gpowerful; the voice of the Lord is full of majesty.</p>

Shows the power of the Lord physically and spiritually.</p> <p>Remember the true POWER of God. Where does say the POWER is seen?</p> <p>Hebrews 4:12</p>	<p>5 The voice of the Lord breaks the cedars; the Lord breaks ^hthe cedars of Lebanon.</p> <p>6 He makes Lebanon to ⁱskip like a calf, and ^jSirion like a young ^kwild ox.</p> <p>7 The voice of the Lord flashes forth flames of fire.</p> <p>8 The voice of the Lord shakes the wilderness; the Lord shakes the wilderness of ^lKadesh.</p> <p>9 The voice of the Lord makes ^mthe deer give birth³ and strips the forests bare, and in his temple all cry, “Glory!”</p> <p>10 The Lord sits enthroned over ⁿthe flood; the Lord sits enthroned ^oas king forever.</p> <p>11 May the Lord give ^pstrength to his people! <p>When things go bad we tend to blame it on someone or something. However, how often do we ascribe success to God when things are good?</p> <p>Pray from the mountain tops and the valleys!</p> <p>Often human nature says’ “Look what I’ve done!” But the soul in prayer says, “Thank you Lord for without You I am lost and helpless”.</p> <p>5 Immediate circumstances are not always the most important. Focus on the spiritual, not just physical. Parable of the Sower</p> <p>6 David warns that he has fallen for the trick of trusting in riches of this world.(Pride)</p> <p>Realizing this David turns to God for help guidance, support and it is God that changes him from being down in the dumps to being happy and dancing.</p>	<p>I will ^sextol you, O Lord, for you have drawn me up and have not let my foes ^trejoice over me.</p> <p>2 O Lord my God, I ^ucried to you for help, and you have ^vhealed me.</p> <p>3 O Lord, you have brought up my soul from ^wSheol; you restored me to life from among those who ^xgo down to the pit.¹</p> <p>4 Sing praises to the Lord, O you ^yhis saints, and ^zgive thanks to his holy name.²</p> <p>5 ^aFor his anger is but for a moment, and ^bhis favor is for a lifetime.³ Weeping may tarry for the night, but ^djoy comes with the morning.</p> <p>6 As for me, I said in my ^eprosperity, I shall never be ^fmoved.”</p> <p>7 By your favor, O Lord, you made my ^gmountain stand strong; you ^hhid your face; I was ⁱdismayed.</p> <p>8 To you, O Lord, I cry, and ^jto the Lord I plead for mercy:</p> <p>9 “What profit is there in my death,⁴ if I go down to the pit?⁵ Will ^kthe dust praise you? Will it tell of your faithfulness?</p> <p>10 ^lHear, O Lord, and be merciful to me! O Lord, be my helper!”</p> <p>11 You have turned for me my mourning into ^mdancing; you have loosed my sackcloth and clothed me with gladness,</p> <p>12 that my ⁿglory may sing your praise and not be silent.</p> <p>O Lord my God, I will give thanks to you forever!</p>

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
